DeKalb PAGE STAR Students Named

The DeKalb Chamber honored the County's best and brightest students at the annual PAGE STAR Student Teacher Award Luncheon in March. Sixty students and teachers from DeKalb County Schools, Decatur City Schools and several private high schools were named the 2011 STARS during a luncheon at the SmokeRise Golf and Country Club, in Stone Mountain. John Bachman, WSB Action News Reporter and host of the HI-Q academic game show served as the award program's moderator.



STAR begins each year in participating high schools throughout Georgia when the STAR student is named and chooses a STAR teacher to share in this recognition. To obtain the STAR nomination, high school seniors must have the highest score on the 3-part SAT test in their high school and be in the top 10 percent of their class, based on grade point average.

The STAR Student with the highest SAT Score in this group is selected to represent the County at one of twelve Regional PAGE STAR events.

Ramona Tyson, DCSS Interim Superintendent announced the 2011 Regional STAR Students, which included Lakeside High School senior John Ewing and his STAR teacher, Michael Washington. Both attended the Regional STAR luncheon at the Windermere Golf Club in Cumming in March.

The Professional Association of Georgia Educators Foundation has coordinated the statewide program since 1994 in association with the Georgia Chamber and the Georgia Department of Education. DeKalb's event was sponsored by corporate members AT&T and Oglethorpe Power Corporation.
