AND IMPACT

In 2016, DeKalb Chamber awarded Selig Enterprises with the inaugural Economic Development Project of the Year Award for the Suburban Plaza development. The award recognizes a major development project that contributes to the job and population growth of a community in DeKalb DeKalb.

Suburban Plaza is estimated to generate \$150 to \$250 million in annual sales and create an estimated 400 to 450 full- and part-time jobs.

Tenants include Chamber members: LA Fitness, Half Price Books, Brain Balance of Decatur, and A Smile 4 U.

DeKalb Chamber is one of the primary owners of **DeKalb Thrives**, DeKalb County's Economic Development Strategic Plan. Under DeKalb Thrives, DeKalb Chamber is responsible for:

- Strengthening talent pipeline by creating professional service programs for High School students
- Developing effective job training programs
- Developing workforce development programs for construction and related trades fields
- Expanding educational partnerships and internships with private sector
- Organizing stakeholder visits to communities that have successfully improved education outcomes

Public Advocacy

KEY BILLS IN 2016



HB 596

PASSED

Modification of DeKalb County's Homestead Exemption Time Limitation

Extends the freeze on property taxes for DeKalb County homeowners until the year 2022. From the 2016 General Élection, a majority of DeKalb residents voted "yes."



SB 209

PASSED

Incorporation of the City of Stonecrest

Allows for the incorporation of the City of Stonecrest, outlining the city's boundaries, powers and effective date. From the 2016 General Election, a majority of DeKalb residents voted "yes" to incorporate the City of Stonecrest.



VETOED

Campus Carry Gun Bill

Authorizes licensed gun holders to carry and possess firearms in or on certain buildings or properties of public institutions. Gov. Nathan Deal vetoed the bill.



HB 515

PASSED

Incorporation of the City of Tucker

Allows for the incorporation of the City of Tucker, outlining the city's boundaries, powers and effective date. A majority of DeKalb residents voted "yes" to its incorporation in 2015 and Tucker was officially incorporated in 2016.



VETOED

Religious Liberty Bill

Exempts religious officials from performing marriage ceremonies in violation of their legal right to free exercise of religion, and businesses from employing, or providing goods or services to those that impact their religious freedom.



Opportunity School District

Allows the establishment of the Opportunity School District and authorizes district's intervention of qualified failing public elementary and secondary schools. A majority Georgians voted "no" to Opportunity School District.










Education & Workforce Development




